1st Argentina

Population	45,851,378
Urban	92.7%

Please pray with Latin Link Argentina:

- ACIERA, Argentina’s evangelical umbrella group, estimates nearly 20% of the population is evangelical. Pray this growing movement produces faithful disciples and true servants of Jesus.
- Last year, President Milei granted Protestant churches legal status, ending decades of discrimination and putting them on equal footing with the Roman Catholic Church. With decree 486/2025 issued, they ceased to be civic associations like any neighbourhood soccer club. Give thanks for this recognition and intercede that churches use it wisely to impact society for Christ.
- The current government has been polarising yet transformative. It claims poverty dropped 20 points through reduced corruption and more efficient social spending. Austerity brought inflation below 2% for three months running, the first time since 2017, while foreign currency controls were lifted. The number of ministries was downsized from 18 to 8. Pray for those hurt by the sharp shift toward libertarian principles or left vulnerable by the changes.



Eden Andrews is in her second year of her two-year Stride programme. She works with children, adolescents, and young adults at two Anglican churches and helps in the kitchen of *Proyecto Compartir* (a soup kitchen for homeless people), among other things.

Hans, Priscilla and Josh Breekveldt, live in Salta. Rebi and Mathias live in Belgium. Hans is the coordinating pastor of San Andrés Church and teaches Bible courses elsewhere. Priscilla supports two pastoral teams in Salta and has a wider role in the Anglican Diocese of Northern Argentina. She is part of member care teams and the leadership of the *Perspectivas* course. Josh has completed his Music degree and is considering next steps. Rebi and Mathias both work in the context of the Anglican Church in Belgium.

Hazel and Martin Frost, with Joni and Danny, live in San Francisco. They preach and teach in their local church, and Martin runs the tech side. Hazel has some teaching hours in a challenging school in a deprived neighbourhood and works with disabled people at a riding stable. She is also involved in a homework club and a Scout group. Martin works on some Christian technology projects and mentors some individuals. The Frosts also support several people with different needs. Hazel is part of the Southern Cone **leadership team**.

Daniel and Flavia Lescano, with Sofi, live in Salta. Daniel, in his role as Vicar General of the Anglican Diocese of Argentina North, supervises and trains pastors and leaders from indigenous and urban areas in the region. Flavia is part of a church planting project in an area outside the city of Salta and, as a doctor, provides healthcare to Indigenous people. Flavia is also part of the Southern Cone **leadership team**.

Hannah Wilson, a recent Sociology graduate, will do Stride at San Andrés Church, in Salta, from January to July, combining her passion for people and cultures with sharing God's love with others. She will lead a kids' club, facilitate women's gym classes, and help with midweek gatherings; and assist with a twice-weekly food programme for the homeless, preparing and serving meals. During July, Hannah will support short-term mission work in rural indigenous communities assisting with the children's programme and itinerant training seminars.

Please pray with Latin Link Bolivia:

- Please pray that the new government would be more open to working with the evangelical church and Christian institutions.
- The evangelical church in Bolivia is enthusiastic in its evangelism but is hampered by questions of integrity, legalism and a lack of unity. Please pray for revival in Bolivia.
- As the Bolivian church matures, denominations are starting to see that they have a role to play in mission. Please pray that more churches would be awoken to this reality and seek to play their role.

Daniel Allen is based in Cochabamba. He works in the area of mission mobilisation within the Latin Link Bolivia team, promoting mission in local churches and local pastors. He also is involved in *Carachipampa* Christian School in the areas of discipleship and Bible teaching. Daniel will be getting married to Micaela, a Bolivian national, in April 2026.

- Praise God for how he has led many Brazilians into intercultural mission over the last decades. Pray for wisdom for the Latin Link Brazil team to discern their role in partnering with the Brazilian church in mobilisation in the years ahead.
- In 2026 there will be presidential elections in Brazil. Pray that the Brazilian church may demonstrate Christian unity amidst a sharply polarised society, and that Latin Link Brazil may encourage this and exemplify Christ's power to reconcile.
- Members of Latin Link Brazil are spread out over a massive country! Pray that our attempts to foster community may be effective, helping us to encourage and care for one another in spite of the distance.



Paul and Suzanne Crothers work with the *Vale do Senhor/Ramá* (Valley) Project in Recife. It is a Christian community-based project, reaching out to children, teenagers and families. Paul's main focus is a football ministry with teenage boys whilst Suz's project supports disadvantaged teenage girls.

- After last year's elections, a new president will be installed in March 2026. Pray for him/her to govern wisely for the next four years.
- Chile, once deeply rooted in Catholic tradition, is now shifting toward a mindset where everyone defines their own truth. Few engage with any church, evangelical or Catholic, unless raised in it. Pray that the Church remains relevant, sharing the gospel with clarity and love amid this profound cultural shift.
- Economically, Chile was once considered a model country in Latin America. However, today, due to various factors, poverty has increased rapidly and there are many people living on the streets. Those who suffer the most are the children. Please pray that the Church may be a source of support for those most in need.



Benjamín and Ruth Curín, with Abigail and Matías, are planting a church in Temuco which is part of the Anglican Church in Chile. Benjamín oversees pastoring the church through preaching, discipleship and Christian counselling. He is also completing a master's course in Christian Leadership. - Pray that God will raise up a generation of young mobilisers within the churches; a harvest of young people with a missionary vision who can take the gospel of the kingdom not only to their community, but also to other places/cities/nations.

Step – Short-term teams

Alongside churches, Steppers participate in a wide range of ministries; from the personal, such as Christian outreach and children's work, to the practical, such as church construction and meeting the basic needs of the local communities.

In 2026, we have the following teams planned:

Spring (March - July):

The Britain and Ireland team will be sending two Step teams to Latin America for four months. While one team serves in the north of Colombia, another will be travelling to Ecuador and then Argentina to work alongside local churches. Please keep the Steppers in your prayers as they prepare to depart in March and serve in Latin America.

Summer (July/August):

Britain and Ireland will also be sending shorter 4-week teams in July and August. They will be partnering with various projects and churches across Latin America and Spain.

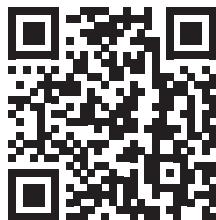
